- Increase **capacity** amongst ILRI's key stakeholders and the institute itself




# ILRI Resources

- Staff: 700.
- Budget: \$60 million.
- 30+ scientific disciplines.
- 120 senior scientists from 39 countries.
- 56% of internationally recruited staff are from 22 developing countries.
- Large campuses in Kenya and Ethiopia.
- 70% of research in sub-Saharan Africa.

# Resource Context of CGIAR Research Programs (CRPs)

- ***CRP on Livestock and Fish***

Focus: productivity and performance of the smallholder pig value chains in Vietnam.



- ***CRP on Agriculture, Nutrition and Health***

Focus: mitigation of risk of food borne diseases, zoonoses and emerging infectious diseases, and improving child nutrition through animal source food. Entire region.



- ***CRP on the Humidtropics***

Focus: integrated crop-livestock-tree – NRM interventions for system productivity and risk mitigation across the Greater Mekong



- ***CRP on Climate Change, Agriculture and Food Security***

Focus: technologies, policies, mitigation and adaptation strategies related to climate change. Entire region.
